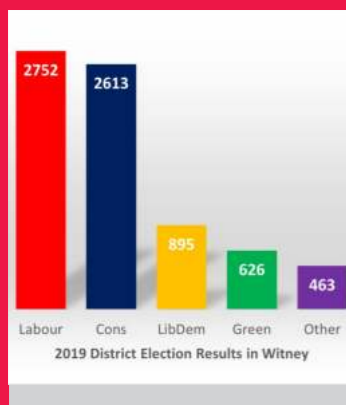
Looking Forward, not Back
