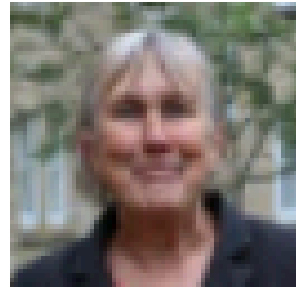


BACKING STUART 4 WITNEY SOUTH

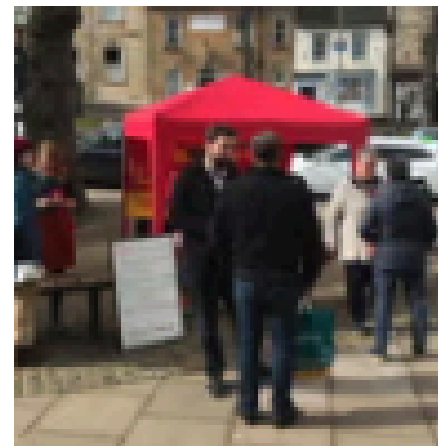

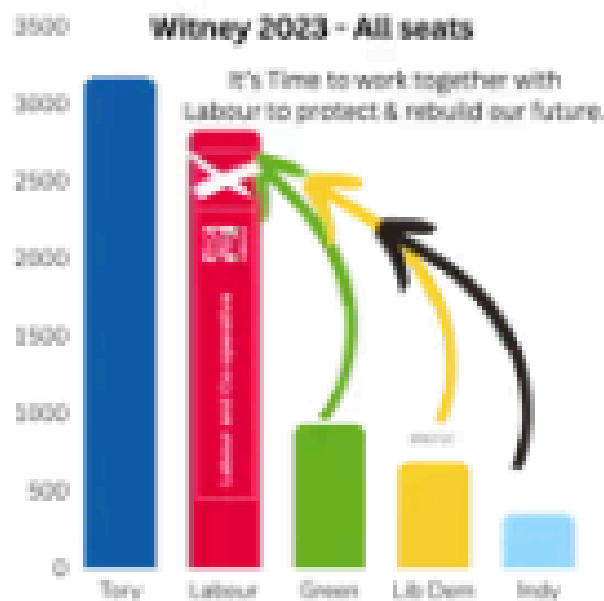

Spend to save initiatives I'll support our investing a little when we'll see long term reductions in council spending, or to create new income streams not on your tax bills.



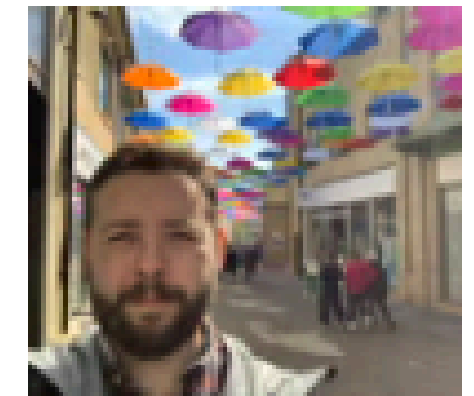

More bobbies on the beat Despite Tory promises Neighbourhood Police teams remain understaffed. Community policing is key to restoring confidence in the police and deterring drug dealing and anti-social behaviour.

The Tories have hollowed out neighbourhood policing. Towns are being left behind.

Cut knife crime - not youth services Funding for crime prevention measures has been slashed, Tim would prioritise resources on areas with highest crime levels.

Stop the Surge in Shoplifting Up 38% in Thames Valley over the last year alone. Work with local businesses to identify repeat offenders and introduce "Respect Orders" to ban them from crime hotspots.
